Important dates for Programs Beginning Fall 2010

APPLY

OCTOBER 2009

- Access to the online college application at ontariocolleges.ca

DECEMBER 1, 2009

- First date that 2010/2011 application data will be sent to colleges.
- Earliest date that colleges may acknowledge applications.

FEBRUARY 1, 2010

- Applications received and paid for on or before this date will be given equal consideration by the colleges.

Note: Applicants are encouraged to apply before this date as website volumes are at their highest at this time. This is not a deadline for submitting applications. After this date, applications are still processed, but are considered by the colleges on a first-come, first-served basis.

OFFER

FEBRUARY 1, 2010

- Earliest release of offers by the colleges to all applicants. Offers will continue to be issued until programs are filled or wait-lists are established.

ACCEPT

FEBRUARY 1, 2010

- Earliest date that applicants may confirm an offer of admission.

NOTE: Students who do not have the entrance requirements may be notified that they do not qualify for admission at any time during the application process.

MAY 3, 2010

- Applicants must confirm their acceptance of an offer of admission to their chosen program through ontariocolleges.ca by this date. Each college will determine the due date to confirm offers made after May 3, 2010. Check your offer package for details.

JUNE 15, 2010

- Earliest date that colleges may require payment of tuition fees.

TRANSMISSION OF DATA*

Data files are due at Ontario College Application Service (ocas.ca), by the dates specified below.

NOVEMBER 20 - 25, 2009

First data transmission

Demographics, marks history, current and projected registration for all potential graduates.

Note: First semester mid-term marks due with this transmission. Schools may send interim marks for full-year courses as soon as they are available, in a subsequent electronic update.

FEBRUARY 12, 2010

Second data transmission

Final first semester marks and currently enrolled second semester courses for semestered schools, as well as interim marks for non-semestered schools.

Note: The S1 record (Demographic Data) and G1 record (Grades Data) are mandatory with each transmission. In cases where January graduates have been retired from student information systems, we still require their final marks and proof of graduation in the February data transmission.

APRIL 23 - 28, 2010

Third data transmission

Mid-semester marks for semestered schools and updated interim marks for non-semestered schools.

JULY 2, 2010

Fourth data transmission

Second semester final marks and proof of graduation for semestered schools, and final marks and proof of graduation for non-semestered schools.

AUGUST 27, 2010

Fifth and final data transmission

Second semester final marks (and/or summer school final marks, if applicable) and proof of graduation for semestered schools. For non-semestered schools the data consists of final marks (and/or summer school final marks, if applicable) and proof of graduation.

*Data transmissions are supplied to OCAS by the high schools.

What you need to know! General Information

APPLY ONLINE

Access the online application at ontariocolleges.ca.

New Users

- To begin an application, select **Apply** and click **Apply Now**.

If you have already set up an account

- return to your application to make changes or check its status.

Click Apply. After logging in to the application, select the link of the date you would like to start college. Note that some collaborative college-university programs require you to apply through the Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC).

If the program you want is not listed in this guide, use the Find feature on our website (ontariocolleges.ca/find) or contact the college offering the program for further instructions on how to apply.

ONLINE HELP

Click on the "Help" feature located along the top of the application for help at any time. Also, as you move your mouse cursor over text, pop-up boxes will open with more details about what is required.

REQUIRED FIELDS

Fields marked with an asterisk (*) are required. You will not be able to submit the page unless these fields are completed. Required fields include: personal information, such as your name, address, date of birth, citizenship, etc. Note: Social Insurance Number (SIN) is not a required field.

YOUR ONTARIOCOLLEGES.CA APPLICATION NUMBER IS IMPORTANT!

An application number will be assigned to you electronically.

This unique identifier helps us track your application through the application process. Keep this application number handy so that you can provide it if you need to call the Customer Contact Centre or the colleges.

APPLICATION PROCESSING FEE (\$95)

The \$95 application processing fee applies to your application. The fee covers all college and program choice changes made to the original application for programs beginning August 1, 2010 through to July 31, 2011.

This fee also covers secure online service, email notifications, imaging of paper documents, infrastructure for the online transcript request services, new systems development, staffing, and contact centre support, including extended hours during the peak application period.

Your payment must accompany your application. Applications submitted without the application processing fee will not be forwarded to your college choice(s). The date the payment is received will be considered as the date your application is received.

There are no exemptions from this fee. Other fees may apply depending upon the type of applicant you are.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

For program-specific admission requirements, applicants should refer directly to college websites and calendars. Links to colleges can be found at: ontariocolleges.ca/find.

COLLEGE AND PROGRAM SELECTION

Select up to five programs with no more than three program choices at any one college. Colleges will give equal consideration to all program choices listed. Be sure to list your choices in order of preference. The colleges use this information for statistical purposes.

PROCESSING YOUR APPLICATION

ontariocolleges.ca processes college applications but has no part in admission decisions.

MAKING CHANGES TO YOUR APPLICATION

Make changes or check the status of your application online or by calling the Customer Contact Centre (see page 11). Any program choice changes made will show the date they are received at ontariocolleges.ca. If changes are received after February 1, 2010 for fall 2010 programs, this may affect the “equal consideration” of your application.

Do not submit more than one application for programs with start dates between August 1, 2010 and July 31, 2011. Application fees paid on duplicate applications are NON-REFUNDABLE, so be sure to select and pay for the correct application cycle.

TRANSCRIPTS

Transcripts are a record of your grades and help the colleges determine your eligibility for admission to college. Transcripts will not be returned to you. Keep a photocopy for your records. Transcripts “faxed” by applicants will NOT be accepted.

RETURNING TO A COLLEGE PROGRAM

If you previously attended a college program and have been away for a period of time, and now wish to return to the same program at the same college, contact the college admissions office for details on how to apply.

APPLICANTS WITH SPECIAL NEEDS

Colleges attempt to provide reasonable support services for students with special needs (for example, learning disability, physical disability). Contact the Special Needs Office at the individual college(s) to explore the services available to you. Early identification of your needs will help make the transition to college a smooth one.

PRIVACY STATEMENT

OCAS Application Services, Inc. (“Ontario College Application Service” or “OCAS” or “ontariocolleges.ca” or “ocas.ca”) is committed to protecting the privacy of your personal and academic information and other school records (“Personal Information”).

Before you endorse the application, it’s important that you read and acknowledge the online Privacy Statement when you complete your application.

Without your electronic signature, you will not be able to continue with the application process.

PAPER APPLICATIONS

Your application information takes much longer to reach the colleges when using the paper process.

Over 95% of applicants use the quick, easy-to-use and secure online application.

PRIVACY STATEMENT

OCAS Application Services, Inc., ("Ontario College Application Service" or "ontariocolleges.ca" or "OCAS" or "ocas.ca") is committed to protecting the privacy of your personal and academic information and other school records ("Personal Information"). The Personal Information referenced in this application, and related materials, is collected in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Ministry of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. M.16, and the Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. M.19.

Your Personal Information will be collected and used primarily for the purpose of making admissions related decisions, including the creation, processing and maintenance of your application, acceptance and registration with the colleges. In order to facilitate the application process, you consent to and authorize OCAS to collect and use your Personal Information, whether obtained directly from you or other relevant sources, including but not limited to previous institutions which you have attended, the Ontario Universities' Application Centre ("OUAC") and any relevant government ministries.

OCAS must disclose your Personal Information in order to process your application, acceptance or registration and to facilitate the issuance of income tax receipts. Personal Information is also used by OCAS, the Colleges, the Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities, the Ministry of Education, the Ministry of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs and the Ministry of Health, as well as other educational research agencies approved by OCAS, for statistical, marketing and research purposes. Consistent with these purposes, your Personal Information may also be linked with student information databases maintained by the college which you eventually choose to attend in order to develop and maintain appropriate policies, programs and funding mechanisms.

You therefore consent to and authorize OCAS to disclose your Personal Information to individuals, organizations and institutions that require such information for program monitoring, research, taxation or funding purposes, or are involved with the processing of your application, acceptance or registration. These entities include, but are not limited to the colleges, associated universities (e.g. for those applying to collaborative or joint programs), Ontario high school counsellors and/or other support staff (for those currently enrolled in high school), third party service providers, and relevant provincial and federal ministries or agencies.

Your Personal Information will be processed through OCAS (located at 60 Corporate Court) and archived at secure off-site facilities.

It is your responsibility to make sure that the information submitted is truthful, complete and correct, failing which your application may be delayed or invalidated. You must also take appropriate measures to safeguard login information and any printed copies of the completed application.

Who Are You?

The type of applicant you are determines what you do with your transcripts.

Current Ontario High School Students

Remember to tell your Ontario high school counsellor that you are applying to college. Your current high school will submit your transcript to ontariocolleges.ca.

After your application processing fee has been received and processed, you will be able to view your grades online. Check your grades in:

- early December
- early March
- mid-May
- mid-July

Please see your guidance counsellor if you have any questions.

ATTENDING AN ONTARIO NIGHT SCHOOL, SUMMER SCHOOL, OR TAKING CORRESPONDENCE COURSES

You are responsible for mailing to ontariocolleges.ca, proof of registration and all subsequent interim reports and final transcripts for these courses. Remember to write your application number on all documents.

Ontario College/ University Graduates/ Students

Request official transcripts by completing the online ontariocolleges.ca Transcript Request Form that is located on the Online Services Main Menu screen (click on My Transcript Request).

A \$10 college and/or university transcript request fee applies for each transcript you request. There is no charge if you are requesting transcripts from a college or university with a lifetime transcript fee agreement.

Be sure to request the appropriate number of official college and university transcripts (one official transcript for each college destination). You do not need to request a transcript if you are applying to the same college you previously attended.

Note: Some colleges may still require your high school transcripts in addition to your college/university transcripts to ensure that prerequisites have been met.

Paper Ontario college/university transcripts are not accepted.

Ontario High School Graduates / GED Holders

Make arrangements to send your Ontario high school transcript and/or GED test results to ontariocolleges.ca. Check our website to see if your previous high school transcript can be requested online. A fee applies. If your school is not listed, contact the school you last attended to obtain an official high school transcript and forward it to ontariocolleges.ca. (Applicable fees are set by individual schools.)

Out-of-Province Students (outside of Ontario - within Canada)

It is your responsibility to request that your out-of-province high school, college, university or other transcripts be forwarded to ontariocolleges.ca by your previous school.

Attending a high school, night school, summer school, or taking correspondence courses:

You are responsible for mailing to ontariocolleges.ca proof of registration and all subsequent interim reports and final transcripts for these courses.

Out-of-Canada/ Internationally Trained Applicants

Mail to ontariocolleges.ca:

- All official academic records of your high school, college and university education. Send originals or certified copies of all certificates/ transcripts in the original language and the English or French translation. These documents cannot be submitted online. ontariocolleges.ca reserves the right to request original or official documents to be sent directly from the issuing institution.
- Proof of English proficiency if you are applying to a program taught in English. If English is not your first language, you must send the results of the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or another internationally-recognized English language assessment test. Contact the college you wish to attend to find out what test and score is required there. (Use the Institution Code of 0211 when taking the TOEFL test.)
- A photocopy of your Record of Landing or other immigration document that shows proof of your residency status.

Although great care is taken in processing your documents, if envelopes are received overstuffed, documents may be torn or damaged. We are not responsible for any documents damaged during this process.

INTERNATIONAL DOCUMENT ASSESSMENT FEE (\$60)

The \$60 international document assessment fee covers the evaluation of academic documents from outside of Canada. An assessment, indicating the highest level of education attained and subjects successfully completed, will be sent to each of the colleges listed on your application.

INTERNATIONAL DOCUMENT RETURN FEE (\$10)

If you wish to have your original or certified documents returned to you, you must pay the \$10 international

document return fee. (Allow four to six weeks for documents to be returned.) Documents are returned by regular mail service to the address listed on your application. Please make sure that this address is complete and up-to-date.

INTERNATIONAL GENERAL ASSESSMENT REPORT FEE (\$50)

An official summary report of the assessment is available for \$50. Applicants may request the report online or by calling the Customer Contact Centre.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE ASSESSMENT

TOEFL: The Test of English as a Foreign Language is used to evaluate the English language skills of people whose first language is not English. For more information, visit www.toefl.org or call 1 877.863.3546

IELTS: The International English Language Testing Service is another internationally recognized English language assessment test. For more information, visit www.ielts.org.

If you have taken language tests not listed above, please contact the college directly to determine whether they will meet language testing requirements.

NOTES FOR ALL APPLICANTS: If you are currently attending or have attended Academic Upgrading at an Ontario college, contact the college for information about obtaining a transcript.

Be sure to include your application number on all documents you are mailing to ontariocolleges.ca

If you have attended a postsecondary institution, you are required to provide that information in your application.

Offer of Admission

ADMISSION DECISIONS

Colleges will begin to inform applicants of their admission decisions for fall 2010 programs as early as February 1, 2010. Admission decisions for programs that start at other times of the year will be sent out throughout the year.

CONFIRMATION OF ACCEPTANCE

You could receive more than one Offer of Admission depending on the number of colleges and programs to which you have applied.

Confirm the offer to the college of your choice, on or before May 3, 2010. Each college will determine the due date to confirm offers made after May 3, 2010.

You may accept only one offer at a time.

Not all colleges will acknowledge receipt of your Confirmation of Acceptance. The other college(s) to which you have applied, receive notification of your accepted offer.

CONFIRM YOUR ACCEPTANCE OF AN OFFER ONLINE

Confirm your acceptance of an offer online by following these easy steps:

1. Go to **ontariocolleges.ca**
2. Click on **Confirm**.
3. Click on **Confirm Now**.
4. **Sign in** to your account using your username and password.
5. From the Main Menu, click on **Offer of Admission**.
6. Click on the **link for the date** that you want to start college.
7. Select the Offer of Admission you would like to confirm and click on the **Confirm** button.

OFFER STATUS

REVOKED - The offer has been withdrawn by the college and is no longer available to you.

SUSPENDED - The offer has been suspended by the college because the program is no longer being offered.

EXPIRED - The expiry date has passed and this offer is no longer valid.

Contact the college(s) directly for more information about the status of offers.

ALTERNATE OFFERS

Alternate offer(s) may be made by the college to which you applied if the college cannot accommodate your original program choice(s).

Contact the college(s) directly for more information about alternate offers.

CHANGES TO YOUR CONFIRMATION OF ACCEPTANCE

If after accepting an Offer of Admission, you change your mind or receive another offer that you prefer, you may accept the new offer (after one business day has passed) so long as you confirm the offer through ontariocolleges.ca by the expiry date stated by the college. ontariocolleges.ca will inform the college that you have accepted its offer and your current acceptance will automatically cancel your previous acceptance.

APPLICANTS WHO HAVE NOT BEEN OFFERED ADMISSION

If you were not accepted into a program, use the Find feature on our website (ontariocolleges.ca/find) to search for up-to-date information about other programs offered across the province and their availability (open, wait-list or closed).

You're IN! Now what? How to Pay for College

TYPES OF FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

BURSARIES Cash award or equivalent, based primarily on financial need, but academic standing may also be considered.

SCHOLARSHIPS Cash award or equivalent granted for educational expenses. It is usually based on academic achievement, although financial need may also be considered. Recipients are selected according to criteria established by the donor.

GRANTS Cash award or equivalent given to a student or potential student to help that person continue his/her studies. Repayment is not required.

LOANS Cash that must be repaid.

For most sources of funding, applicants must meet certain citizenship, residency and program requirements. Application deadline dates vary. Confirm specific information with the individual organizations.

ASK YOUR COLLEGE

The college you plan to attend may offer grants, loans and/or scholarships.

For information about scholarships and bursaries offered by individual colleges, please contact the college's Financial Aid Office or visit their website.

ONTARIO STUDENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (OSAP)

- Assists qualifying full-time and part-time students from Ontario.
- Apply as early as possible. You should submit your OSAP online application at least 10 weeks before classes begin.
- There is no charge for applications filed through the OSAP website. An application fee of \$10 will apply for students filing paper applications.
- Paper application forms can also be downloaded from the OSAP website.

GARFIELD WESTON MERIT SCHOLARSHIP

- Up to 116 awards ranging from \$2,500 to \$40,000, based on demonstrated leadership potential and community involvement.
- Students entering two- or three-year college diploma programs or those who are currently enrolled in a two- or three-year program are eligible to apply. Some bachelor's degree programs are also eligible.

CANADA MILLENNIUM SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

- Bursaries may range from \$1,000 to \$4,500 (\$3,000 on average, up to a lifetime limit of \$23,250) and are granted to full-time undergraduate students with significant financial need.

ONTARIO TRUST FOR STUDENT SUPPORT

- Up to \$50 million in funds raised by colleges and universities will be matched to establish endowments for student assistance. Consult individual colleges for information.

QUEEN ELIZABETH II AIMING FOR THE TOP TUITION SCHOLARSHIP

- Provides awards of up to \$3,500 per year, renewable for up to four years.
- Aid for students who earn top marks but require financial assistance.
- Students who graduate high school in 2009 are eligible.
- Check "yes" on the application if you intend to apply for this scholarship.

Terms and Definitions

ADVANCED STANDING

By meeting special admissions criteria, an applicant may be eligible for admission directly into the second or subsequent semesters of a program. Criteria may vary from college to college.

GENERAL EDUCATION DEVELOPMENT (GED)

An international testing program for adults who have not been able to complete high school. It is a series of tests that measure knowledge and academic skills against traditional high school graduates. For more information, visit <http://www.ilc.org/cfm/GED>.

HIGH SCHOOL APPLICANT

Students taking one or more high school level courses through day school, night school, summer school, adult education, continuing education or correspondence between September 1, 2009 and August 31, 2010.

HIGHLY COMPETITIVE PROGRAM

This refers to a program for which the number of qualified applicants exceeds the program's capacity. These programs normally do not accept applications after the February 1 equal consideration date (for fall enrolment).

MATURE STUDENT

Over 19 by the first day of college and do not have a high school diploma or GED. Mature students are still required to complete course prerequisites. Individual colleges may contact you with further instructions on completing tests that may be required in the admission process. For degree programs, applicants must check with the individual colleges for admission requirements. Please note that the colleges, not ontariocolleges.ca, determine if you are eligible for mature student status. (Note: If you completed high school, even decades ago, you will still be considered a high school graduate.)

PREREQUISITE

A specific course or admissions test that is required in order to qualify for admission and/or selection.

PRIOR LEARNING ASSESSMENT AND RECOGNITION (PLAR)

Individuals with significant work and/or life experience can have their skills and knowledge assessed for course credits toward a college certificate or diploma.

TRANSFER CREDIT

Transfer credits from other postsecondary educational institutions will be considered on a per-course basis. Transfer credits will be granted where, in the opinion of the college, the work covered is equivalent in content or objectives to the corresponding course of study. 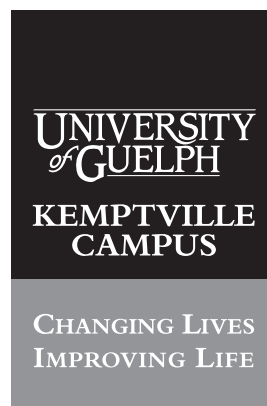

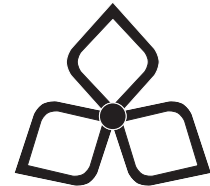

Types of Programs

Diploma (Regular/Advanced Diploma)

Regular diploma programs require the completion of at least four semesters (or two years) of study, as approved by the Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities. An advanced diploma is granted after three years (6 semesters) of study.

Co-op

Scheduled periods of employment in related industries within the academic year help co-op students connect in-school training with real work experience. These placements are typically paid positions and are usually a requirement for graduation. Also offered are unpaid field placements, work terms, and internships.

Certificate

Certificate programs require the completion of two semesters (or one year) of study, as approved by the Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities.

Bachelor's Degree

Four-year applied academic programs offer the best of both worlds—experience gained in practice and insight found with the help of theory. Bachelor's degree programs are reviewed by the Postsecondary Education Quality Assessment Board (PEQAB). More information can be found on their website:

Joint College-University Programs (Collaborative)

Collaborative programs offer the combination of hands-on learning that colleges are known for with the more theoretical approach of university studies. Students may earn either one or two credentials—one from the college and/or one from the university.

Graduate Certificate

Building on knowledge and experience gained through previous postsecondary study, graduate certificates require a university degree or a college certificate or diploma for admission. Co-op options may also be available for these programs.

Apprenticeship

A great way to obtain practical experience and skills, apprenticeship programs devote 75 to 90 percent of their learning time to on-the-job training and the remaining time to classroom instruction. Apprentices are paid for the work they do and become certified in their trade after completing requirements set by the province.
